
Biggest Ferris-Wheel in the Americas!

Candidates hold forth at church's forum

The candidates were out to make their cases and answer questions from a panel of young teens. About 150 people turned out to witness it all. For the second time this year, Real Family Fellowship Church, located off Pearson Lane, hosted its Voice of Christianity General Candidate Forum. Last spring, the church played host to a variety of precinct elections battles. The second forum – held Oct. 21 – offered folks who survived the primaries one last chance to pitch their platforms before the Nov. 4 election.

"I was pleased with the turnout – especially the number of candidates we had," moderator Jon Moffett said. The top race of interest to northeast Parker County residents seems to center around the battle for the Precinct 1 commissioner's spot. The ballot includes a Republican, George Conley, a Democrat, Clint Hall and a Libertarian, Tom Clayton who is currently a Springtown City Councilman.

Each candidate was given three minutes to talk about himself and his platform.

Conley, a longtime Springtown businessman, said his many years of community service is an indication

that he cares about what happens to northeast Parker County. If elected, he said he will "listen to the people" and work hard to meet their needs.

Hall, also a business owner, said he is the only candidate with "extensive road construction experience." He said his late father in law, longtime commissioner Waymon Wright, helped him become a better businessman. That same training should also help him become a better commissioner, if elected.

Clayton, who is in his second term on the Springtown City Council, said he is the only candidate who has served in office and understands the inner workings of a governmental body. He spent a couple of minutes taking about how the commissioner's job isn't just about road repair. He said 90 percent of a commissioner's job is "public policy making" and a wide variety of other tasks. Less than 10 percent is road work - which he says he already has a good idea about after sitting on the city council and other city committees. Local teens from the church asked each of the candidates three guestions pulled from audience suggestions.

The questions were as follows:



Would you consider a paid trash pickup for the residents of Precinct 1?
What do you plan on doing to help with the water usage of the oil and gas companies?

3) How do you plan on getting the oil and gas companies to help with road repairs? Clayton said he would be in favor of trash pickup. Such a service would help alleviate the long lines at the county's biannual trash collection days, he said.

He said the rules are "already in place" for a new water district that will manage water usage.

"There's not a lot we can do in local government because it's overseen by the state," he said.

However, Clayton said he would be in favor of stricter regulation of the big water users – aka the gas and oil companies.

He said the law already regulates weight limits for big trucks.

"It's a law enforcement issue," he said. "If they're overloaded – then they're breaking the law."

Hall said he would support having a central, paid trash collection area for Parker County. Having two trash collection days a year isn't nearly enough, he said

Hall said a water district has already been established to help monitor water usage. He said he doesn't have a problem with the district charging fees to companies that produce more than 25 gallons of water per minute for commercial use. However, he thinks municipalities should be exempt from such fees – which is not currently the case. Hall said the truck weight limits need to be enforced.

"They need to obey the same laws as anybody else does," he said.

Conley said having a central recycling area is a "good idea – if we can afford to do it."

Conley, who owns his own water well drilling company, said he is extremely concerned about salt water contamination in the county's water supply. He said he would make it his goal to stay on top of all water related issues.

Enforcing truck weight limits is an important issue – with a simple solution, he said.

"We'd put the sheriff on their butt, stop their trucks – then weigh them," he said.

Sheriff makes his case

Incumbent Parker County Sheriff Larry Fowler – a Republican opposed by Democrat Joey Blanton – said he decided to run for office nearly four years ago because "Parker County law enforcement was in a difficult situation."

He said he's proud of the strides the department has made over the past few years. He said he is proud of the fact that Parker County now has six or seven patrols on any given night compared to only three when he took office. That's a good thing, since his department is responsible for providing law enforcement for a 900 square mile area, he said.

The completion of a 288-bed jail expansion gives the county 450 total beds. As a result, the county no longer has to pay other jails to hold its prisoners. In fact, the federal government may start housing some of its prisoners in Parker County.

"In my opinion, we need to start collecting the rent instead of paying it," he said,

The county's arrest record is also up substantially since he took over, Fowler said.

During a recent 90 day quarter, the sheriff's department made 290 arrests. In 2004, before Fowler took over, there were only 290 arrests for the year, he said.

"And we're going to stay busy," he promised.

He said the war against drugs is his main priority.

"If you do dope – I'm going to find you," he said. Blanton was unable to attend.

King, Randolph do battle

Phil King, a Republican seeking another term as the state representative for District 61, said he's proud of the state's financial condition – especially compared to the federal government.

"We don't have a trillion dollar debt," King said. "In fact, we have a \$10 to \$14 billion budget surplus to use."

King said he supports right to life legislation.

Charles Randolph, King's Democratic challenger, said he doesn't think things "are as good as they could be" in Parker County.

A train dispatcher, Randolph said he was encouraged to run by several people who want to see a change. He said he is concerned about the county's water table and over usage by oil and gas companies. He said it's one of the main reasons he decided to run.

Both men said they support the right of families to decide how to educate their families – one of the questions asked by the church teenagers.

King said he voted against allowing casino gambling in Texas – even though, on the surface, the state might be losing some extra revenue.

"One guy told me it would be a good way to control organized crime," King said. "That's my point – if there's not casino gambling, there's no organized crime." Randolph said he doesn't think casino gambling is a good thing.

King said the booming oil and gas drilling industry has been good for the local economy and has helped create jobs.

At the same time, it's been bad for county roads and the environment.

"We want their businesses here, but they have to obey the rules," he said.

King said he has never felt pressure by the oil and gas industry to follow any agenda.

Randolph said has refused to take campaign contributions from large companies. He said his campaign is backed by small donations.

"You can't own me," he said.

The forum also included visits from U.S. House of Representative, District 12, candidate Tracey Smith, State Board of Education, Place 11 candidate Bruce Beckman, Precinct 3 Commissioner candidate John Roth and 2nd Court of Appeals Justice Terrie Livingston.

Parker County Judge Mark Riley discussed the county's \$80 million road transportation bond which is on the Nov. 4 ballot.

Brent Baker discussed the pros of passing a \$96.2 million bond that will build facilities for an overcrowded and outdated Weatherford College.

Republican County Chair Zan Prince and Democratic County Chair Deborah Cascino both heavily promoted their candidates abilities to serve Parker County.

Both cited their party's strong support of family values.

Prince said her party believes in less government intervention and an individual's abilities to solve their own problems.

Cascino talked briefly about her parties belief that all Americans should have the opportunity to "move up" in society.
